# RABBI'S CORNER

The seasons are important. We need them. Fall brings with it a calming spirit, winter gives rest, spring brings the reminder of new life and summer is just fun. What's more is that our Jewish calendar follows the pattern that surrounds it by the natural motion of the world around us. During the fall we turn toward our great questions, looking inward and reflecting on the High Holy Days.

Winter brings the moments when we huddle together for warmth and set our own light in the world with Hannukah. Spring has Purim and Passover, when the budding flowers outside mirror the celebration of freedom we mark with our own gatherings. Summer, however, really has no holidays.

To be fair Shavuot, the celebration of the receiving of the Torah and the receiving of cheesecake (the latter may be apocryphal), takes place right at the beginning of summer, but the holiday falls so early that the season is not yet in full swing, and it feels much more like a spring holiday. Tisha B'av is oddly placed in the middle of summer, a memorial day, but we rarely make much of it.

So often our holidays are chock-full of rituals that guide our vision toward one thing or another. We take a moment to look inward, to notice the power of our actions or to voice gratitude for our community. During the summer, we can't help but notice the beauty that's right there. The daylight is extended, as if to tell us to keep our eyes open, to drink in the very last drop of the world before it goes to sleep for the night. The world is in full bloom, and so are we. If we did have a holiday in the summer, it would have to take place outside.

Summer truly is one grand holiday, a season of Shabbat. We work through the full year, setting our sights in the fall and running through the finish line in spring. So I invite us to do this: go outside. I invite us all to take walks, to celebrate the open air and the sun on our backs, to take in this sabbath. We deserve it.

I'll leave you with words written by one of our most influential rabbis, the grandson of the founder of hasidic Judaism, and the forbearer of modern Jewish storytelling, Rabbi Nachman of Bratslav.

may it be my custom to go outdoors each day  
among the trees and grass - among all growing things  
and there may I be alone, and enter into prayer,  
to talk with the One to whom I belong.

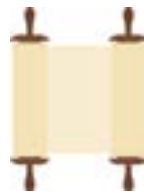

## WHAT'S NEW

One of the important and beneficial aspects of reading is that you usually learn, or gain insight, about something you may have been unaware of beforehand. For example, many of us have heard of the German-American ship, the *St. Louis*, that carried more than 900 passengers, most of them Jewish refugees, in May, 1939. The *St. Louis* was not allowed to land at its original destination in Cuba nor was it permitted entry to the United States. However, how many of us knew that 22 Jewish passengers were granted permission to embark in Cuba and limited numbers were allowed in Great Britain, France, Belgium and Holland? In Europe, only the 287 admitted to Great Britain were safe. We rarely hear about the 22 Jewish refugees in Cuba, although author Armando Lucas Correa, a Cuban-born writer who is not Jewish, did learn about them from his grandmother. He has written, *The German Girl*, a novel depicting a fictionalized family of refugees, their life in Germany in the nineteen thirties, their life on the voyage, and their life for decades as refugees in Cuba. The author becomes an authentic sounding voice of 12 year-old Hannah and, many years later, of her namesake, Anna, a young American girl whose father died on September 11, a few months before she was born. The sense of loss and identity are profoundly portrayed in Correa's lyrical and well-researched novel. Adding to the impact, at the end of the book there are photos of passengers as well as their signatures on the ship's log. Correa's own life story and the current plight of refugees enable his writing to be all the more relevant.

Look for both fiction and non-fiction books in your Temple Library to enhance your knowledge of world events, human nature, and a variety of subjects of interest to you.

Temple Library is open and available to you for browsing and borrowing whenever the building is open – and that includes the summer months. Come in and say, "Hello."

## Shalom Chaverim!

We are very excited to launch our new JEWISH LEARNING PROGRAM beginning in August 2018. We will continue to offer our Judaics curriculum – which includes Torah and Bible, holidays, and life cycle – as well as specials including library, cooking, music, and arts. We have added four NEW components, each designed with individual goals and desired outcomes that utilize and combine best practices from around the country all in one place and one program.

- I. Hebrew Through Movement (grades K-7) - Sunday  
*Engaging interactive spoken Hebrew for all ages—spoken Hebrew only.*
- II. Hebrew Decoding (grades 4-6) - Sunday  
*Develop Hebrew reading and writing skills using a variety of written materials – NOT prayer-based.*
- III. B'nai mitzvah preparation (grades 4-6) - Weekday  
*Weekday intensives – 30 minute sessions designed to prepare students to become a Bar or Bat Mitzvah – prayer-based*
- IV. Kehila (community) time (grades K-7) - Sunday  
*Grade-specific social and interactive activities centered on a Jewish value led by Madrichim each week.*

The first three components come together to emphasize the *LIVING NATURE* of the Hebrew language. Hebrew is a key component of a healthy and active Jewish identity. Hebrew is not limited to prayer and reading the Torah.

B'nai Mitzvah preparation is separated out from the other Hebrew curriculum, to emphasize that Hebrew is the living language of the Jewish people and isn't only reserved for prayer. B'nai Mitzvah preparation will take place only during the week.

The fourth component is explicitly designed to build community in our classrooms. Led by Madrichim (our teen assistants), students will engage in activities and games centered on a Jewish value.

We know that change is difficult for everyone, and while we are confident that our new program is the right one for us, there will need to be changes and adjustments along the way. Please be patient and stay involved as we move forward into this exciting new endeavor!

## A NOTE FROM GUCI CAMP DIRECTOR JEREMY KLOTZ

In these competitive times, we know that many families measure the value of spending a summer at GUCI in Avodah or on Staff against the potential benefits of gaining “real world” experience through an internship or other work experience. Planning strategically for future employment or acceptance into college is a very personal thing, taking into account many factors and considerations. I won’t pretend to be an expert on what’s best for any particular family or student. However, I can attest to the great benefits I gained through my work years ago on staff at camp, and would argue that it is not only “real world experience”, but essential preparation for future success.

Our staff have very real, and very significant, responsibilities. Our focus as leadership is to transition young staff members from participants to leaders. We train them well, and give them immediate responsibility for the well-being of young kids. They have many resources to aid them, but they are the front-line people working directly with the kids, sleeping with them in the cabins, and managing the different personalities, conflicts, and behavioral issues presented. To be successful, our staff develop and use problem-solving skills, compromise, and persistence to maintain the high standards of programming, supervision and creativity we require of them.

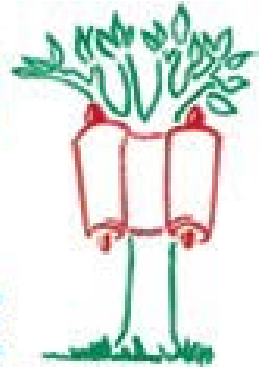
In addition, and unlike some other camps, our staff are our primary program planners. They own many aspects of our elective and social programs and are responsible for delivering our education programs on teams with our Faculty. To be successful, they must manage their time wisely, learn to work well in groups under time pressures, and accept accountability for the success of the programs, or lack thereof.
