PREPARING YOURSELF FOR THE HIGH HOLY DAYS

We are never as cognizant of the cyclical nature of our lives than at the approach of Autumn. For those still connected to the academic cycles of summer break and the beginning of classes, this time of year always provides ample opportunity to reflect, prepare and consider our place along life's journey. And for all of us, the changing of leaves and subtle changes in the temperature signal the season's change, the shortening of days, the coming of winter.

Judaism's rituals are designed to enhance and magnify this awareness of our lives and our world. In a few short weeks, we will gather together, reconnect, check in and note what it feels like to be one year older. Familiar chords will bring old melodies to life, the choir will welcome us in white robes once again, and yet, perhaps, we will be more aware of the things that have inevitably changed from last year to this year. A wonderful new Cantor, our new High Holy Day prayerbook, some new melodies to enhance the more familiar ones, even new congregants!

There is an old story told about the young Rabbi who spent hours and hours at his desk pouring over the prayerbook in the days leading up to Rosh Hashanah. His more experienced mentor approached and said to him, "These prayers haven't changed in a thousand years. It would be better to spend less time preparing those words, and more time preparing yourself!"

Our High Holy Days will be beautiful. We will share moments of inspiration, elevation and meaningful conversation. But for them to be most meaningful, the days and weeks from now until then should find us asking important questions of ourselves. Here are a few questions to ponder over the days ahead. I pray that your answers might lead you to days truly filled with awe and a more honest day of atonement on Yom Kippur.

1. What is something I detest about others which I tolerate in myself?
2. What is standing in my way from truly living the life I imagine?
3. Who has emotionally invested in me, and how can I show them how much that means to me?

CARING COMMUNITY CORNER

With the High Holy Days just a month away, IHC's Caring Community Corps (CCC) volunteers are again preparing to connect in three ways with congregants whose health challenges prevent them from attending services at IHC during this period.

For the third consecutive year, CCC volunteers plan to deliver flowers the day after Yom Kippur to congregants receiving care in hospitals, other health care facilities or their homes to let them know that the congregation hasn't forgotten them.

Having successfully piloted the project last year, CCC expects to expand its delivery and return of High Holy Day *Machzorim* (prayer books) lent to incapacitated IHC congregants who borrow them to participate during WICR-FM's broadcasts of select IHC High Holy Day services. We encourage congregants who can depend on a friend or relative to get/return the books to take advantage of those resources, so that we can ensure that delivery and return by our volunteers will be available to those most in need.

Having led the Moments of Remembrance at IHC on Friday evenings for more than a year, CCC volunteers are prepared to bring their skills and sensitivities directly to congregants whose limitations prevent them from honoring their loved ones by going to cemeteries and attending the Yizkor service during the High Holy Days. While visiting, the volunteers will provide opportunities to say prayers and let congregants share memories of those they are remembering.

The CCC will do its best to provide the services described above to all congregants who request them. However, the number of flowers, *Machzorim* and volunteers are limited; therefore, we urge all congregants to request the services as soon as possible. We also know that there may be potential recipients who will need someone else to contact us to request the service on their behalf. Finally, without sufficient volunteers to make the connections, the CCC won't be able to serve all congregants who want them. Whether you volunteered before and are ready to re-commit or are available to volunteer for the first time, we want to hear from you! The 2018 theme of the annual Temple Library-Religious School sponsored reading incentive program was *IHC Superheroes – Let The Reading Adventures Begin!* Congratulations to the 41 students who reported on 111 books. Heartfelt thanks to Rosemary Borek, who once again chaired the program, and to volunteers Rachel Silien, Deb Wagner and Drew Lybolt-Wagner.

There is excitement in the air as we start a new program year. We look forward to the launch of the Religious School's new innovative and comprehensive curriculum, and we welcome the opportunity to meet and greet Cantor Aviva Marer. Erev Rosh Hashanah is on September 9, last minute preparations are underway in August as we anticipate the observance of the New Year 5779. We hope to see you all on Sundays and during the week whenever possible.

Start the year on the "right" foot by visiting your Temple Library, browse and borrow library books, let us know what you have been reading, what types of books interest you and, as usual, check to see if you have any library books to return. Also, if you are able to join us during any of our Jewish Book Club sessions, you are most welcome to attend.

WHAT'S NEW

I have always considered the High Holy Days to be a holiday season we "observe" rather than "celebrate." That does not mean the Days of Awe are totally somber, but those ten days include more inspirational and contemplative moments than are found in secular holiday traditions.

So what can you read during this time of year that is both uplifting and informative?

For adults, look for two comprehensive works: *The Rosh Hashanah Anthology* and *The Yom Kippur Anthology*, both compiled by Philip Goodman and originally published by The Jewish Publication Society in the early 1970s. Rabbi Philip Goodman was active with Jewish educational and historical associations and edited several holiday anthologies for JPS. Temple Library has the 1992 paperback edition of *The Rosh Hashanah Anthology* featuring an introduction by Ellen Frankel, the JPS editor at the time. She comments on the solemnity of the High Holy Days but notes the "messages of joy" the holidays evoke as well.

For Rosh Hashanah, Goodman provides historical background dating to biblical times, traditional texts, prayers, scriptural readings, symbols, rituals, customs, folklore, music, recipes, crafts and literature from all over the world. The Yom Kippur Anthology is similar in format and both volumes contain children's poetry and stories providing an opportunity for the entire family to learn and to be inspired.

The younger set will enjoy *The Hardest Word: A Yom Kippur Story*, by Jacqueline Jules, the first in a popular series of stories featuring the Ziz, a Jewish mythological big bird. Children love the vibrant illustrations by Katherine Janus Kahn and are intrigued by the Ziz trying to guess what is "the hardest word." It isn't "rhinoceros" or "encyclopedia" or "ridiculous" – you'll have to read the book to find out!

If you want to add a new dynamic to your family's holiday observance, *Apples and Pomegranates: A Family Seder For Rosh Hashanah*, by Rachel Musleah and illustrated by Judy Jarrett, may be for you. The author, whose family heritage is from Iraq, grew up in Calcutta, India. She has created a version of the type of seder her family conducted. The brief seder highlights blessings, stories and music, while focusing on eight different fruits and vegetables (along with recipes) for a unique experience.

The call numbers for High Holy Day books are 242, 242.1 and 242.2. Make this High Holy Day season a blessed time for you and your loved ones. Temple Library is open and available to you for browsing and borrowing whenever the building is open. Come in and say, "Hello!"

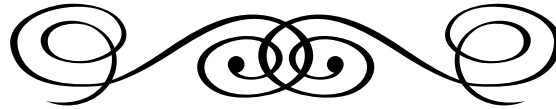
